Further to my note below to Ana Monsaive (I should have sent it to you), from April 21 to July 30, I worked the Deepwater Horizon blowout on the containment team. Several of us working the incident were in a "position critical" where we did not have weekends, holidays, or our normal Fridays off. I am not sure if I am owed comp. days for that time work. I was in charge of the team that built and installed the capping stack on the blowout. We were in a position early on to install a cap and the decision was made to do the top kill first. After the top kill falled we where again going to install the cap then the decision was made to use the top hat and containment. I was then move to the Q4000 flaring operation for 10 days then back to the capping stack until it was installed and the well shut-in toward the end of July. After that I moved to the plug and abandonment team for two weeks then went on vacation for a week. I counted up the weekends, holidays and Fridays off and it came to 30 comp. days owed to me. I have taken 10 days between GoM and goling to work for BP Brazil to get my head straight and motivation level back to normal after working the 3+ months on the most horrific project of my career and actually started working for Greg Blome and BP Brazil on Monday, August 23, 2010.

The tally on comp, days owed to me (if GoM decides to give those back) is 20 days. There are numerous other people in the GoM that gave up more and are still working 24/7 on the incident.

Could you find out from your GoM counterpart if comp, days are being granted to us. I know GoM management was discussing this. Thanks,
